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TONGA MALL: COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS

Tonga Mall, in the Malelane area of Mpumalanga (beyond Nelspruit) is being built by Fortris, architects Equilibrium.

A series of workshops to involve the community in art for the Mall, and to give back to the community in terms of skills, have been run by veteran workshop host and Grammy winner Robin Hogarth. The workshops are followed by the learners producing mural pieces of Nguni cattle from the area, as well as artworks for their own use, using artists and skills from Art Afrique (Carol Hogarth).

Robin Hogarth is the South African representative of Artists for Human Rights, and a briefing on this campaign is the introduction to the workshops. The learners are then taken through aspects of how to create art from the book 'Art' by L Ron Hubbard, and aspects of the Way to Happiness by the same author, in particular the precept 'Safeguard and Protect your environment'.

They then apply these skills to producing the artworks.

Each workshop had a bright banner acknowledging the creators of the mall, and the architect, as well as Artists for Human Rights and Art Afrique – and these were acknowledged in each workshop.

Workshops were run in 5 local schools on the 3rd 4th and 5th December, with a total of 113 learners and teachers doing the programme.

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This is a summary of results from the programme:
